

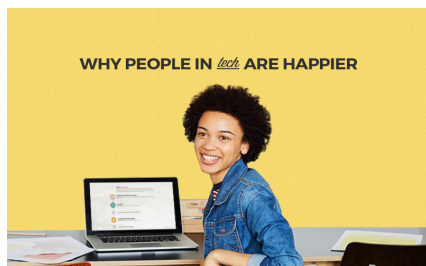
The 13 most in-demand tech jobs for 2019
